Pediatric Dentistry: Anesthesia, Pulp Therapy and Stainless Steel Crowns

When the Affordable Care Act mandated dental as an essential health care benefit for those 19 and younger, millions of pediatric patients were added to 150,000 dental practices. Treating children likely became a necessity for your dental office. Pulp therapy and stainless steel crowns are procedures often considered complex when performed on pediatric patients—this course will alleviate any fear of the unknown that leads to this misconception. Indirect pulp therapy, pulpotomy and pulpectomy are discussed, with emphasis on diagnosis and technique. Stainless steel crowns are also discussed, with procedural steps explained and shown. The course also discusses Wren's process for using nitrous oxide, appropriate topical anesthesia and local anesthesia to achieve painless injections.



Opening Our Eyes to CBCT in Endodontics: A View from the Inside by Dr. Brett Gilbert

The use of CBCT technology in endodontics allows us to view dental and oral structures in a more clear and accurate way than ever before so that in all aspects of endodontic care, assurance is provided that the clinical situation is truly understood. This multimedia course is designed to teach the standard clinical protocols for using 3D imaging and to show how CBCT helps to assess, diagnose, treat and evaluate the outcomes of endodontic cases.

Fundamentals of Fixed Prosthodontics
